Ana G. Méndez University provides reasonable accommodation to students with functional diversity, in compliance with state and federal laws that protect and guarantee their rights. Reasonable accommodation arises from the Federal American with Disabilities Act of 1990 (ADA). This law protects the rights of people with disabilities, its purpose is to eliminate discrimination against people with disabilities and guarantee equal opportunities.

What is a reasonable accommodation?

A reasonable accommodation is a modification or adjustment to the educational setting that allows the student with disabilities to participate and perform in his or her academic functions under equal conditions as other students who do not have disabilities.
