Título IX

Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972 is a federal civil rights law that prohibits sex discrimination in education programs and activities. It is applicable in public and private elementary and secondary schools, school districts, educational institutions, and universities that receive federal funds. Under Title IX, sex discrimination can include sexual violence, assault, and harassment. This Law protects all students regardless of the sex of the person who commits the assault or the victim. All students are protected by Title IX regardless of disability, nationality, immigration status, sexual orientation, or sexual identity.

Universidad Ana G. Méndez (UAGM), Carolina Campus has a Title IX Coordinator as the contact person who addresses all discrimination complaints based on sex that arise within the university community. If you have doubts regarding the provisions of Title IX, you should contact Diana M. Colón Román, Associate Dean of Students. Her office is in the Deanship of Students.
