

PROFESSIONAL LICENSURE AND CERTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS Bachelor of Sciences in Landscape Architecture

Several programs offered at Universidad Ana G. Mendez – Gurabo Campus are designed to meet the educational requirements to obtain a professional license or certification, mandatory by state law in order for a university graduate to be employed in a specific occupation. The following disclosure contains information about the US jurisdictions for which the program in reference is designed to meet the educational requirements for a specific license or certification.

Requirements for professional licensure and certification vary from state to state, and prospective students are responsible for understanding the requirements in the state in which they plan to work after graduation. UAGM does not guarantee that a student will obtain licensure, certification or employment. Please note that the following information relates only to the educational requirements for the licenses and certifications listed below and is specific to the institution/campus stated above. Other requirements and prerequisites may apply to these licenses and certifications, such as that an applicant successfully complete a criminal record check or other background screenings.

The **Bachelor of Sciences in Landscape Architecture** offered at UAGM Gurabo Campus, is designed to meet the educational requirements to apply for the exam required to obtain the license issued by **Junta Examinadora de Arquitectos y Arquitectos Paisajistas de Puerto Rico** (Board of Examiners of Architects and Landscape Architects).

The institution has determined that its curriculum *meets* the educational requirements to apply for the board exam and obtain the licensure required for employment as a **landscape architect** in Puerto Rico and all states, specifically the following, which require accreditation by the Landscape Architectural Accreditation Board (additional state requirements may apply in jurisdictions other than Puerto Rico; visit https://www.clarb.org/apply-for-licensure/view-licensure-requirements for further information):

Washington, Oregon, California, Idaho, Montana, Arizona, New Mexico, North Dakota, South Dakota, Nebraska Minnesota, Mississippi, Wisconsin, Illinois, Alabama, Florida, North Carolina, Virginia, New York, New Jersey, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, Maine and Hawaii.

The institution *has not determined* that its curriculum meets the educational requirements for state licensure or certification required for employment as **landscape architect** in the following US jurisdictions:

American Samoa, Federated States of Micronesia, Marshall Islands, Palau and U.S. Virgin Islands.
