

PROFESSIONAL LICENSURE AND CERTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS Doctor of Naturopathic Medicine

Several programs offered at Universidad Ana G. Mendez – Gurabo Campus are designed to meet the educational requirements to obtain a professional license or certification, mandatory by state law in order for a university graduate to be employed in a specific occupation. The following disclosure contains information about the US jurisdictions for which the program in reference is designed to meet the educational requirements for a specific license or certification.

Requirements for professional licensure and certification vary from state to state, and prospective students are responsible for understanding the requirements in the state in which they plan to work after graduation. UAGM does not guarantee that a student will obtain licensure, certification or employment. Please note that the following information relates only to the educational requirements for the licenses and certifications listed below and is specific to the institution/campus stated above. Other requirements and prerequisites may apply to these licenses and certifications, such as that an applicant successfully complete a criminal record check or other background screenings.

The **Doctor of Naturopathic Medicine** offered at UAGM Gurabo Campus and/or its locations, is designed to meet the educational requirements to apply for the exam required to obtain the license of **Doctor en Naturopatía** (**Naturopathic Doctor**) issued by the **Junta Examinadora de Doctores en Naturopatía (Examination Board of Naturopathic Doctors)**.

The institution has determined that its curriculum *meets* the educational requirements for state licensure or certification required for employment as a **Naturopathic Doctor** in Puerto Rico and the following US jurisdictions: Alaska, Arizona, California, Colorado, Connecticut, District of Columbia, Hawaii, Idaho, Kansas, Maine, Maryland, Massachusetts (MA licensed ND doctors in 2017 and is currently working on the promulgation of rules and regulations. It is expected that license applications will become available in early 2021), Minnesota, Montana, New Hampshire, New Mexico, North Dakota, Oregon, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, U.S. Virgin Islands, Utah, Vermont, and Washington.

The University has not made a determination whether its curriculum meets the state educational requirements for licensure or certification required for employment as a Naturopathic Doctor in the following US jurisdictions: Alabama, American Samoa, Arkansas, Delaware, Federated States of Micronesia, Florida, Georgia, Guam, Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Kentucky, Louisiana, Marshall Islands, Michigan, Mississippi, Missouri, Nebraska, Nevada, New Jersey, New York, North Carolina, Northern Mariana Islands, Ohio, Oklahoma, Palau, South Carolina, South Dakota, Tennessee, Texas, Virginia, West Virginia, Wisconsin, Wyoming.
