



PROFESSIONAL LICENSURE AND CERTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS

Master of Architecture (M.Arch.)

Several programs offered at Universidad Ana G. Méndez – Gurabo Campus are designed to meet the educational requirements to obtain a professional license or certification, mandatory by state law in order for a university graduate to be employed in a specific occupation. The following disclosure contains information about the US jurisdictions for which the program in reference is designed to meet the educational requirements for a specific license or certification.

Requirements for professional licensure and certification vary from state to state, and prospective students are responsible for understanding the requirements in the state in which they plan to work after graduation. UAGM does not guarantee that a student will obtain licensure, certification or employment. Please note that the following information relates only to the educational requirements for the licenses and certifications listed below and is specific to the institution/campus stated above. Other requirements and prerequisites may apply to these licenses and certifications, such as that an applicant successfully complete a criminal record check or other background screenings.

The **Master of Architecture** offered at UAGM Gurabo Campus, is designed to meet the educational requirements to apply for the exam required to obtain the license issued by ***Junta Examinadora de Arquitectos y Arquitectos Paisajistas de Puerto Rico*** (Board of Examiners of Architects and Landscape Architects).

The institution has determined that its curriculum ***meets*** the educational requirements for state licensure or certification required for employment as an **architect** in Puerto Rico and the following US jurisdictions that require NAAB accreditation (additional state requirements may apply):

Alabama, Alaska, Arkansas, Connecticut, District of Columbia, Delaware, Florida, Georgia, Iowa, Illinois, Indiana, Kansas, Kentucky, Louisiana, Massachusetts, Michigan, Minnesota, Mississippi, Montana, North Carolina, North Dakota, Nebraska, New Jersey, New Mexico, Nevada, Ohio, Oregon, Rhode Island, South Carolina, Texas, Utah, Virginia, Virgin Islands, West Virginia and Wyoming.

The University ***has not made a determination*** whether its curriculum meets the state educational requirements for licensure or certification required for employment as **architect** in the following states:

American Samoa, Arizona, California, Colorado, Federated States of Micronesia, Guam, Hawaii, Idaho, Indiana, Maine, Marshall Islands, Maryland, Missouri, New Hampshire, New York, Northern Mariana Islands, Oklahoma, Palau, Pennsylvania, South Dakota, Tennessee, U.S. Virgin Islands, Vermont, Virginia, Washington, and Wisconsin.
