<p>Description: The Bachelor degree in Design with concentration in Fashion Design will train students to take part as professionals in all aspects of the garment industry ranging from children's apparel to men's ready to wear to couture. Particular attention will be placed on the history of fashion and its recurring interpretations. Students will be asked to see fashion as a reflection and is recurring interpretations and as a component in a continuum that includes, ethical practice, manufacturing, marketing, promotion, accessorizing, and disposal. Students will not only be instructed in the areas of fashion concept development, but in the technical aspects of the rapidly growing clothing industry.</p>
